Whole Number Place Values. Here is a place value chart for whole (ie: counting) numbers.

Example	Millions	Hundred Thousands	Ten Thousands	Thousands	Hundreds	Tens	Ones
a.				4,	3	2	2
b.		4	6	3,	3	2	9
C.	8,	8	7	1,	8	0	6

Speaking and Writing: (need to know this when writing cheques!)

Example a. is spoken and written: Four Thousand, Three Hundred Forty Two

Example b. is spoken and written: Four Hundred Sixty Three Thousand, Three Hundred Twenty Two

Example c. is spoken and written: Eight Million, Eight Hundred Seventy One Thousand, Eight Hundred Six

Notice how we use commas to set off the groups by millions, thousands, ,etc. And we do not say 'Three Hundred *AND* Forty', we say just 'Three Hundred Forty'. We save the *AND* for the decimal place.

Notice the current method of grouping the digits in a number when written on a computer is to leave a space (eg: 45 241) but of course if writing by hand one should still use a comma.
